



TECHNICAL REGULATIONS EUC KARATE

In general, the European Universities Karate Championship will be organised in accordance with the most recent technical rules of the World Karate Federation (WKF). The following items may differ from these rules as detailed below:

1.) Entry / Competition format / Composition of teams

1.1) Competition format

The competitions will include :

Kumite

I. Individual events

Men: -60kg, -65 kg, -70 kg, -75 kg, -80 kg, +80 kg, and Open

Women: -53 kg, -60 kg, +60 kg, and Open

II. Team events

Kata:

Men: Individual and by team

Women: Individual and by team

1.2) Programme and duration

The programme and the duration of the competitions are fixed by the EUSA Executive Committee in agreement with the Organising Committee. 3 playing days are foreseen.

1.3) Maximum and minimum number of participants

Each NUSA is authorised to enter a maximum of twenty-two (22) persons including seventeen (17) competitors (11 men, 6 women) and five (5) officials:

Each NUSA may enter in :

Kumite

Individual events: one (1) competitor per institution in each category

Team events:

- Team competitions for Men: a team is composed of a maximum of seven (7) competitors and a minimum of five (5) competitors, who must all come from the same institution
- Team competitions for Women: a team is composed of a maximum of four (4) competitors and a minimum of three (3) competitors, who must all come from the same institution

Kata

- Individual events : one (1) competitor per institution
- Team events : three (3) competitors coming from the same institution



2.) Qualification / selection of teams or athletes:

The selection of athletes should be done by the NUSA using the results of its National University Championship

3.) Referres

3.1) Referees:

Referees will be provided by the host.

3.2) Handling of protests:

The handling of the protest is the responsibility of the chief referee.
